Mission

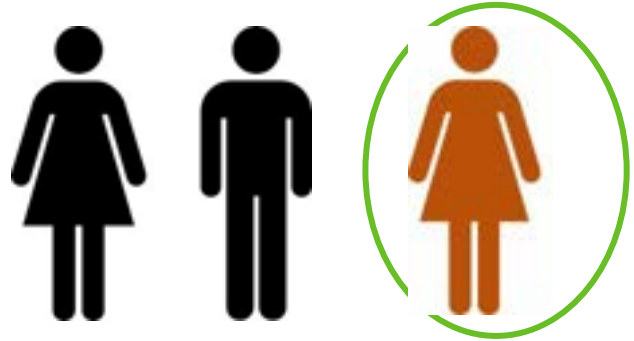
Day One partners with youth to **end dating abuse** and domestic violence through community education, supportive services, legal advocacy and leadership development.

Day One's programs operate on an empowerment model that invests young people in maintaining safe relationships for themselves and their peers, and engages youth in designing projects to raise awareness in their communities.

All direct services for youth under the age of 24 are free and available in English and Spanish.

Did You Know?

1 in 3 teens reports experiencing some kind of abuse in their romantic relationships, including verbal and emotional abuse.



Our Services



- The **legal team** provides legal advice, information, and full representation for youth seeking orders of protection, custody/visitation, child support and/or domestic violence-based immigration help.
- **Our social services** staff provides individual and group counseling and case management services, as well as advocacy and support navigating the criminal justice system.
- The **Relationship Abuse Prevention Program (RAPP)** partners with eight New York City high schools to provide comprehensive, school-based outreach, education, and counseling on teen dating violence and healthy relationships.
- **Community Education** facilitates interactive workshops for young people in middle school, high school, and college that address the warning signs of abuse, dynamics of power and control, different types of abuse, and helping a friend.
- **Early RAPP (ERAPP)** partners with middle schools to provide students with foundational skills and tools to build healthy and safe relationships.

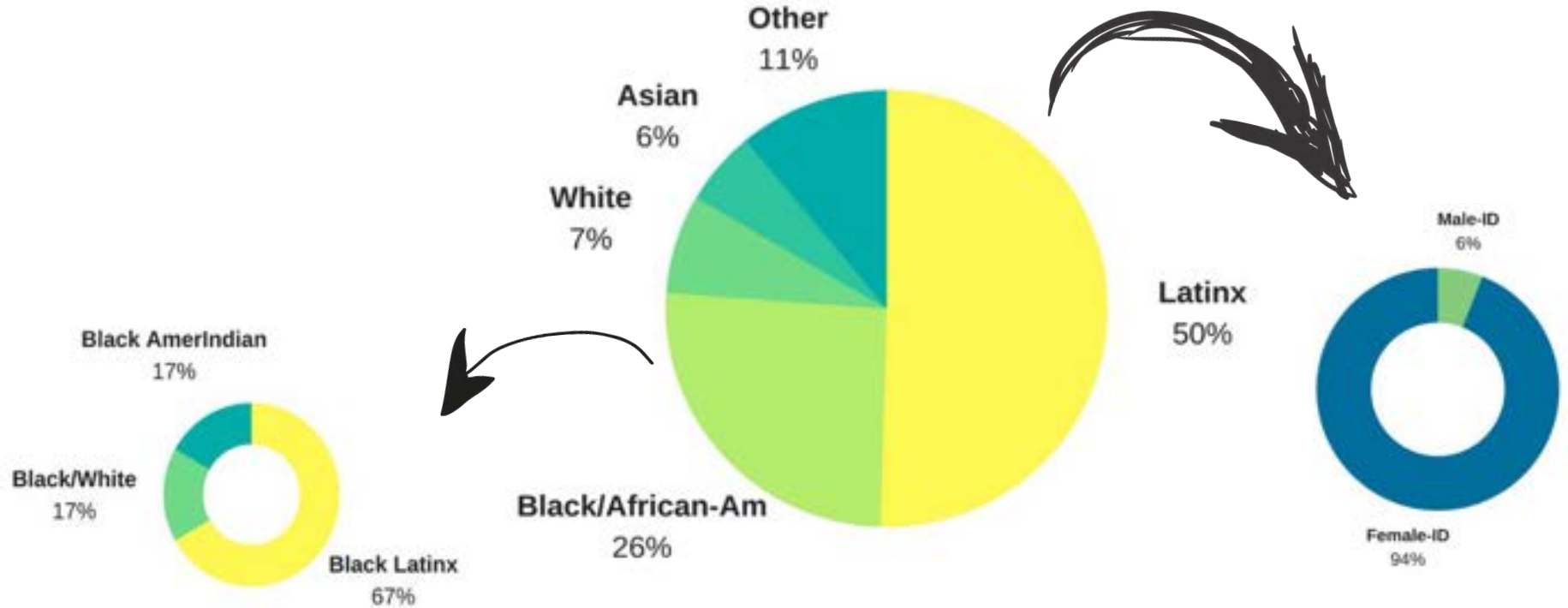

RAPP

Day One's Relationship Abuse Prevention Program (RAPP) partners with high schools across New York City to provide critical teen dating violence prevention and intervention.

Each school hosts a Day One RAPP Coordinator, a licensed master social worker, who provides:

- Trauma informed individual and group counseling
- Classroom workshops to educate school population on relationship abuse
- Professional development for teachers and school staff
- Community outreach to youth, parents, and community member



ERAPP

ERAPP is a New York City-wide initiative partnering with New York City middle schools to bring in healthy relationship education. Our ERAPP educators deliver educational and interactive workshops in 32 middle schools that provide students with foundational skills and tools to build healthy and safe relationships.

Workshops are tailored to the specific needs of each school or classroom community and include interactive activities that engage a variety of learning styles. Each ERAPP educator collaborates with 8 middle schools to provide:

- Classroom workshops on healthy relationships, consent, gender, dating violence and more
- Workshops and trainings with school staff
- Workshops for parents and caregivers
- Community outreach and coordinating

Who Are We?

- The ABLE Program is a Comprehensive Adolescent Pregnancy Prevention Program (CAPP) at NYC Health+Hospitals/Woodhull
- The CAPP Program is an initiative of the New York State Department of Health (NYSDOH) Bureau of Perinatal, Reproductive, and Sexual Health.
- Our target group is youth ages 10-21 and our team of CAPP program providers seek to advance health equity and improve adolescent health outcomes in communities where they can have the greatest impact.

Who Do We Serve?

- NYSDOH funds CAPP programs in areas of high need and prioritizes youth populations that are impacted by health disparities including racial and social injustice.
- Priority Populations include youth:
 - from racial and ethnic minorities
 - from socioeconomically disadvantaged communities and/or living in foster care
 - who identify as LGBTQ
 - with special health care needs
 - who are homeless
 - involved in the juvenile justice system
 - other marginalized adolescent populations



Our providers develop and implement specific activities based on the developmental, socio-economic, racial, ethnic, and cultural needs, resources, and perspectives of the populations they serve.

What is the CAPP Program?

- The CAPP model is based on the social-ecological framework, which recognizes that health is a function of interactions between a person and the resources, opportunities, and supports they have access to or are denied.
- The specific aims of the CAPP initiative are to:
 - Support youth in practicing health-promoting behaviors and reducing risk behaviors;
 - Reduce barriers to preventive reproductive health care services;
 - Promote healthy, safe, and nurturing environments and relationships;
 - Identify risk factors and address special needs (medical, psychosocial, developmental) early through accessible and coordinated supports.

Our Research:

Through our research we have found that certain health inequities can have an impact on the teen pregnancy birth rate. Examples include:

- low-income levels
- low education
- lack of adequate health care
- few opportunities for positive youth development

The Purpose of the ABLE Program:

- To provide comprehensive sexual health education for youth ages 10-21 through the implementation of evidence-based programs
 - To ensure Adolescents have access to confidential teen friendly family planning, HIV, and STI prevention services
 - To expand educational, social, vocational and economic opportunities for teens to build life skills supporting a successful transition into adulthood
 - To advance a local community effort to improve the living environment for adolescents
- The program includes education in:
 - Sexual health
 - HIV/STI's
 - Pregnancy prevention
 - Financial literacy
 - Social media and bullying
 - The program also provides resources to access confidential HIV testing with trained providers and staff who create a teen friendly healthcare haven with successful appointment interactions.

Our Mission:

“To give our youth the opportunity to reach their fullest potential, reducing the number of unplanned pregnancies and providing them with the tools to become effective adults.”

How do we achieve our Mission?

The CAPP model is comprised of two programmatic components delivered to priority populations through evidenced based programs (EBP’s).

- **Component 1** is focused on comprehensive adolescent sexual health education that ensures access to reproductive health care and family planning services.
- **Component 1** activities are defined as
 - circulating information about available family planning health services through EBP’s,
 - providing for individual and/or group discussions about all methods of family planning and family planning services,
 - assisting with arranging visits to a medical family planning provider.
- **Component 2** consists of the CAPP providers co-creating with youth educational, social, vocational, economic, and recreational opportunities to:
 - Provide alternatives to sexual activity; and
 - Develop skills that can support a successful transition into healthy adulthood.
- **Component 2** programming is based on positive-youth development principles and focuses on adult preparation subjects such as healthy relationships, effective communication, career and education, health care transition, and financial literacy.

Evidenced Based Programs

- Comprehensive, evidence-based sexual health education is at the core of the CAPP initiative. Much of our efforts are devoted to the implementation of evidence-based programs (EBPs).

To implement comprehensive, evidence-based, age-appropriate sexual health education, one of the following state approved EBP’s are used:

- Be Proud! Be Responsible!* - designed to help adolescents develop the knowledge, skills, and motivation necessary to change their behaviors in ways that will reduce their risk of contracting HIV and other sexually transmitted infections. It also aims to reinforce self-confidence and pride by using a sense-of-community approach and encouraging sexual responsibility.
- Making Proud Choices!* - is designed to help participants develop the knowledge, skills, and motivation necessary to change their behaviors in ways that will reduce their risk of contracting HIV and other sexually transmitted infections. To support youth in preventing unplanned pregnancies.

WHERE EBPS ARE DONE AT & DEMOGRAPHICS

- **Be Proud! Be Responsible!** – Can be taught in high schools for youth ages 13-18. Can be during school hours or in after school programs. It consists of 6 modules that are 45 minutes to one hour long.
- **Making Proud Choices!** – Can be taught in middle schools for youth ages 10-14. Can be during school hours or afterschool. It consists of 14 modules that are 45 minutes to one hour long.





SUMMER PROGRAMMING

■ GIRLS CIRCLE

- The Girls Circle helps develop healthy relationships and personal empowerment abilities. Provide girls with an understanding of the value and importance of education in the development of their aspirations.
- The participants can communicate and share in a safe space with their peers. The groups create a sense of togetherness and fosters relationships as the groups are small.

■ BOYS COUNCIL

- The Boys Council achieves significant increases in school engagement and positive impacts in boy's masculinity beliefs. The boys can identify the positive and not-so-positive definitions about being male today. The Council lets boys examine the messages that define being male, and gives boys new and different options for self-expression and team experiences, promoting skill building and safe, healthy, positive, and diverse identities.
- It is a strengths-based group approach to promote boys' safe and healthy development through pre-teen and adolescent years.

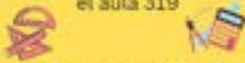
