CELEBRATING HISPANIC HERITAGE MONTH 2024



Hispanic Heritage Month - a celebration of the impact and influence Hispanic Culture has had on our nation. The timing has historical significance, as 9/15 marks the anniversary of independence of five Latin American countries: Costa Rica, El Salvador, Guatemala, Honduras and Nicaragua. It also nods to Mexico and Chile, which celebrate their independence on Sept. 16 and Sept. 18.



Arturo Alfonso Schomburg, also Arthur Schomburg born on January 24, 1874, was a Afro-Puerto Rican historian, writer, and activist and a avid collector of materials on Africa and its Diaspora, amassing over 10,000 documents. In 1926 his personal collection was added to the Division of Negro Literature, History and Prints of the Harlem branch of The New York Public Library and he served as curator from 1932 until his death on June 8, 1938. Today, the Schomburg Center for Research in Black Culture of The New York Public Library is one of the foremost research centers on Africa and the Diaspora, with more than 10 million items.





It's Hispanic Heritage Month! Lucila Padron was born in Puerto Rico in 1916 and moved to New York, and later Brooklyn, as a teenager. She worked in the Cappa-Espinelli garment factory in Williamsburg, Brooklyn and was a member of the International Ladies Garment Workers Union (ILGWU). The ABLE Center mission statement is :
To give our youth the opportunity to reach their fullest potential, reducing the number of unplanned pregnancies and providing them with the tools to become effective adults.

ABLE is a program developed by Woodhull Medical Center. This program does the following:

- Educates Teens on Pregnancy Prevention
- Encourage teens to go beyond their borders and find new opportunities.
- Helping teens become aware of the transmission of STD's as well as the consequences.



Adolescent Practice at Woodhull Medical Center

Both regular primary care and sexual/reproductive care are provided. Primary care means you can get regular check-ups, sports physicals and exams for working papers, immunizations ("shots"), care for conditions such as asthma, advice about eating and exercise, and care when you feel sick. Sexual/reproductive care includes things like birth control, pregnancy testing, treatment for STIs and HIV/STI testing.

Walk-ins are welcome during hours of operation. If you're an adolescent under the age of 18, you do not need to have anyone with you to get sexual/reproductive health care services. You can ask for a confidential visit when making an appointment.

ABLE is a Comprehensive Adolescent Pregnancy Prevention (CAPPI) Program

SAFE

What is safe? We teenagers all know the word but let's put it into a deeper perspective:

- **Safe** is when all of us know how to use a condom.

The Outpatient Adult Mental Health Practice offers a variety of assessment and treatment approaches to adults ages 18 and over. Services include psychological evaluation, individual and group therapy, crisis intervention and medication management. The **Integrated Center for Integrated Health (CIH)**, is a primary care practice team that offers on-site medical assessments and follow-up for patients attending our mental health outpatient practice in conjunction with a psychiatric liaison. For information, call 718.963.7908 or 718.963.8988.

The Outpatient Child and Adolescent Practice responds to the special needs of children between the ages of 5 through 18, and their families. The clinical services include psychiatric evaluation; psychological testing; individual, group, play and family therapy; medication management; and parent counseling. This service also responds to consultation requests. For information, call 718.963.7923.

The Ambulatory Detox Service is an outpatient treatment program for individuals requiring detoxification from drugs and/or alcohol which allows patients to stay at home in the evening and return each morning for treatment. The program operates Monday to Friday from 8 AM - 4 PM. To make a referral, call 718.963.5910 or 718.630.3280.

The Chemical Dependency Outpatient Practice follows the detoxification phase of the treatment continuum and incorporates individual and group therapy services, education, Alcoholics Anonymous and Narcotics Anonymous involvement. To make a referral, call 718.963.5910 or 718.963.8913.

Assertive Community Treatment (ACT) is a service delivery model that provides comprehensive, community-based treatment to individuals with serious and persistent mental illness, who are not able to participate in traditional office based programs. The services provided by the ACT team include a full range of clinical treatment, psychosocial rehabilitation, and community services and resources, designed to promote recovery and improve independent functioning at work, school, home, and in community. All referrals to ACT teams must come through the Single Point of Access (SPSA) process. For referrals please call 212.801.3343.

The Mobile Crisis Management Team provides urgent mental health care and crisis management to patients in the community. The service operates between 8 am through 5:30 pm, Monday through Friday and between 8:30 am and 4:30 pm on Saturdays. 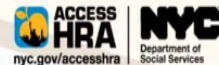

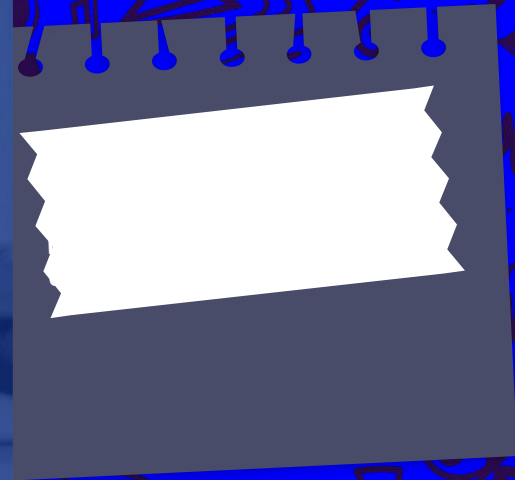

- Be patient when awaiting responses to non-urgent matters.
- Set a positive example by demonstrating a positive attitude toward education.





Back-to-School Tips

FOR PARENTS AND STUDENTS

01 Create a Comfortable, Distraction-Free Study Space

Students...Find a space in your home where you can't hear any background noise, like your parent's conference call or sibling's loud music.

Make sure to keep all distractions "out of sight and out of mind." This includes placing your gaming console in a drawer, keeping pets in another room, or temporarily shutting off notifications for social media apps.





02 Help Your Teen Develop Healthy Ways to Manage Stress

Parents...High school is tough - harder classes, more extracurricular activities, and college/post-grad decision deadlines getting closer each day.

Help your teen manage this stress by promoting healthy ways to cope. Some options include:

- Taking daily walks
- Keeping a journal of their thoughts/feelings
- Expressing themselves creatively through artistic outlets
- Talking to a licensed counselor
- Getting enough sleep
- Making healthy eating choices





03 Use Class Time Wisely

Students...You've heard it before, but if you find yourself with free time after your teacher is done with that day's lesson or lecture, take advantage of it!

Use that extra class time to get a jump on some homework or studying while it's still fresh in your mind.

And...so you have less to do at home!





04 Start "School Time" Early

Parents...After a few months of sleeping in, late nights, and afternoon naps, it can be difficult for your school-aged child to get back into the swing of things.

Put your child back on a "school day schedule" in the few weeks leading up to the first day. Having them wake up at a consistent time and go to bed at a reasonable hour will help ease the transition and set them up for success!



4 ways to talk “with” your teen, not “at” them

1. Give them autonomy.

Showing your teen how to problem solve on their own is also a great start to forging a healthy, communicative relationship.

2. Look at the situation through their point of view.

Try putting yourself in your kid’s shoes, and discuss together a plan of how to tackle a tough issue.

3. Work out “shared solutions.”

State the problem and what your goals are, and then ask your child to suggest solutions to the problem.

4. Provide supportive guardrails.

It’s the difference between simply telling your teen what to do, and providing support and guidance toward a solution.





5 things to say to coach your kids through hard moments

1. "It's OK to feel your feelings. I'm going to stay right here with you until you feel better."

2. "I know it hurts. I promise you aren't always going to feel like this."



3. "Let's take some deep breaths together and see if that helps."

4. "I hear that you're upset. Can you tell me what your body is feeling right now?"



5. "You're a kind person, and I know you love your sister. Sometimes we say things we don't mean when we're angry. What do you think would make her feel better?"





Pathways to Care



Tips for identifying students with possible mental health concerns:

- Consistent sadness and/or irritability (for two or more weeks)
- Decreasing communication in class
- Decreasing motivation to complete assignments (a decline from previous levels of engagement)
- Change in self-care routine for an extended period
- Using language or another indication of self-harm or harm towards others

Connecting to mental health resources

- Reach out to your school mental health support staff: Guidance Counselor, Social Worker, Parent Coordinator
- Introduce the youth to mental health professional staff
- Contact your nearest H+H Child and Mental Health Adolescent Clinic

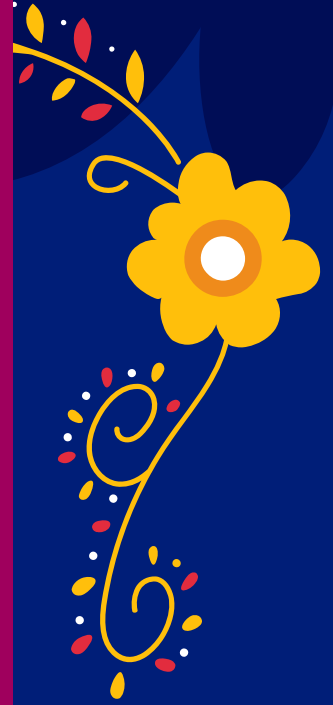

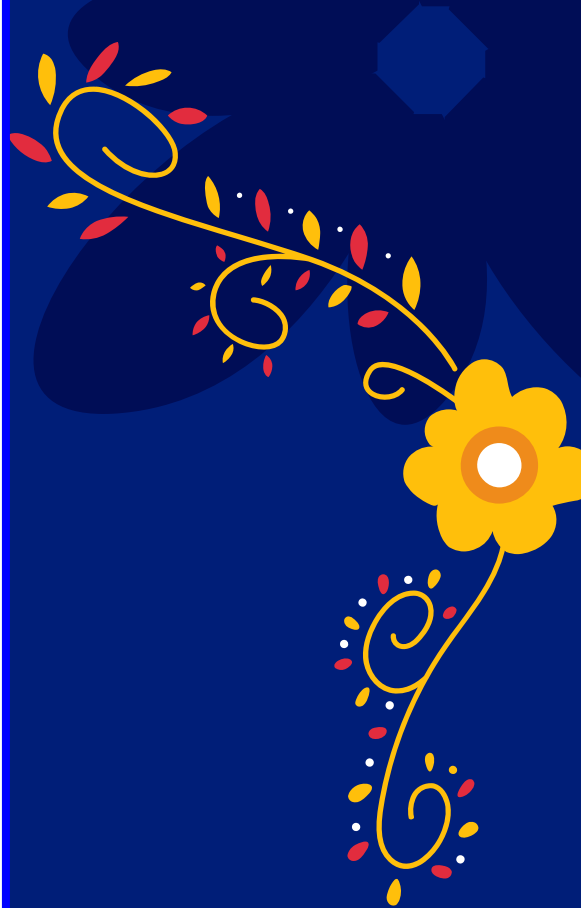
