



### **Cell Phone/Electronics Policy Pilot Reminders**

WCHS is a no phone zone. Non-school electronics are not allowed in the building. All cell phones must be checked upon entry. ### Uniform Policy "Look Good, Feel Good, Do Good"

### BENEFIT ACCESS AND SUPER PANTRY

**Benefit Access Office (BAO):** The Benefit Access Office at TCAH is dedicated to connecting individuals and families with essential services, including SNAP enrollment, recertification, and referrals to other social programs. The team works to eliminate barriers by assisting clients in navigating public benefits, hosting outreach events, and collaborations with schools, shelters, and community organizations to reach those in need. The Benefit Access Office continues to expand its impact through strategic partnerships and innovative service approaches, caring for all clients' needs at a time.

**Super Pantry:** is a vital role in addressing food insecurity by providing nutritious groceries to individuals and families. Staff and volunteers ensure efficient food distribution, and uphold customer service standards to create a welcoming environment. The pantry is committed to help to do their part reducing food inequality within our black and brown communities, and ensuring that clients receive a balanced selection of food based on their needs and wants. Through dedicated service, the Super Pantry remains a cornerstone of hunger relief efforts in the community.









### **URBAN AGRICULTURE**

The TCAH Farm Department is dedicated to increasing fresh food access, promoting sustainable agriculture, and empowering the local community through urban farming initiatives. Operating across multiple farm sites in Brooklyn and Queens, our department cultivates organic produce that directly supports food distribution programs, local markets, and community-based nutrition efforts. We integrate educational programming, workforce development, and youth engagement, ensuring that our farms serve as hubs for both food production and agricultural learning.

Our services include farm-based education, hands-on training for aspiring farmers, and seasonal employment opportunities through initiatives like the Green Teen program. We operate a farm stand that provides fresh, locally grown produce at affordable prices, accept SNAP/EBT benefits, and run the SNAP-Ed nutrition education program to promote healthy eating habits. Additionally, we offer volunteer opportunities for individuals and groups looking to support urban farming, host workshops on sustainability, and collaborate with local organizations to strengthen the city's food system. Through these efforts, the TCAH Farm Department continues to foster a healthier, more resilient community.







### **CYBER PANTRY**

The Cyber Pantry is an innovative, tech-driven food distribution platform that allows individuals to order groceries online, providing a dignified and convenient experience. Through this system, clients can select fresh, nutritious food options based on their needs and preferences while eliminating long wait times. By integrating SmartChoice technology, we ensure equitable food access while expanding our reach to more families across NYC. This model empowers communities by making food assistance more accessible, efficient, and user-friendly.
