

Head of Operations Report

- New cell phone removal pilot went into effect 7/29
 - Policy is a result of letter signed by 41 teachers, stakeholder surveys, research, and comparable policies going into effect at city and possibly state level
 - Cell phones are collected from students at the beginning of each day and returned at the end of day
 - Parents can call the Main Office at 718-782-9830 to contact their child during the day
- Continuing No Phone Zone Pilot Program from Summer School.

If students forget, lose or damage their Yondr, consequences will be issued as per the Community Covenant.





Facilities - New Gym Update





- Manny worked with architect to find alternative solution to permanent easement
- Changes:
 - The second floor usable space was reduced to lower occupancy to 49 people.
 - This removes the requirement of having 2 exits from the second floor. The stairway to the mezzanine will be enough.
 - A lift (small elevator) will be installed to give handicap access to the mezzanine
 - This fulfils handicap requirements allowing access to mezzanine
 - The openings into 198 Varet will be considered convenience openings and not require an easement.



Facilities

- 1- The school's HVAC air conditioning units are all operational
- 2- Both elevators are in working order.
- 3-Elevators 1 & 2 passed their annual inspection with the Department of Building's
- 4- No energy saving demands were requested from the ConEdison NY Demand Response program.
- 5-Three proposals are being prepared to refill the test holes at 188 Varet Street
- 6-No visits from the FDNY, NYPD, EMS, DOB or ECB at the school for the month



Safety

Morning Entry

- A. Students enter the school building through the cafeteria exit doors. The 9th & 10th Cohort are on the left side and the 11th & 12th cohort are on the right side.
 - a. Each group is provided with plastic ziplock bags with 8th period class affixed.
- B. Immediately after they scan ID cards at a second swipe machine to scan in electronic devices.
 - a. (Dean/academy leaders department collects electronics and sort.)
- C. Students then proceed to the walk-through machines and the bag check. Students are reminded to place all loose items in backpacks (keys, coins, pens, watches, etc.).
- D. If a student alerts on the walk through a female and male safety officer is in place to use a metal detector hand wand on students. (All students who are unable to go through the walk-though machine are hand wanded.)
- E. Students found with restricted items will have the items confiscated, and will be referred to the Dean's department.







Safety

Dismissal Procedures

- A. Students who take the school bus to school are asked to come down to the main lobby 10 minutes prior to the last bell to collect their cell phones.
- B. Deans and Academy Leaders distribute student cell phones to teachers and issue the phones to the students at the end of 8th period.
- C. Students will then sign a piece of paper indicating they received it.
- D. Students are dismissed by the school safety manager, floor by floor.
- E. When all floors are clear, all safety officers are instructed to proceed outside the school building to assist with clearing the school block or addressing any other student concerns.



Recruitment and Enrollment as of 8/23/24








This is a draft of the Financial Statement as of June 30, 2024 total collected revenue for the period is \$17,886,227 (88% Per Pupil Revenue, 12% other)

Total expenses for the period are \$20,199,648 million. (61% Personnel Services, 10% Contracted Services, 17% Rent, 2% **Utilities**, 10% Other expenses) Total deficiency of revenue over expenses for the period is (\$2,313,421), the deficit amount will be reduced by \$747,167.11 after ARP-ESSER-3 budget modification is approved and recorded. The total Reduced revenue from Per Pupil from the budget amount is (\$1,621,396)

What are the different funding sources?

Title I, Part A provides supplemental financial assistance to school districts/schools with a high percentage of children from low-income families, to provide all children a significant opportunity to receive a fair, equitable, high-quality education and to close educational achievement gaps.

Title II, Part A is designed to advance excellence in teaching and learning and to promote equity in educational opportunity throughout the State.

Title III is designed to enable English Language Learners/Multilingual Learners and Immigrant Students to develop English language proficiency, as well as access the State's challenging academic standards, through the provision of high-quality instruction and support.

Title IV, Part A provides supplemental funding to help provide students with a well-rounded education, improve school conditions and improve the use of technology.

Allocations

Targeted Assistance

If a Title I school is operating a targeted assistance program, the school provides Title I services to children who are failing, or most at risk of failing, to meet challenging State academic standards.

Schoolwide Program

Schools in which children from low-income families make up at least 40 percent of enrollment are eligible to use Title I funds to operate schoolwide programs that serve all children in the school in order to raise the achievement of the lowest-achieving students.

LEAs also must use Title I funds to provide Title I services to eligible children enrolled in private schools.

WCHS utilizes a schoolwide program. 84% of enrolled students are eligible for Title I funds.
