The third letter of recommendation should be written by someone other than a family member who can attest to the student's propensity to be successful in a rigorous academic program.

Honors Program Course Expectations

Upon acceptance into the Honors program, students are expected to:

- ❖ Maintain a 3.0 GPA in all honors classes
- ❖ Remain in the course(s) for the duration of the year.
- ❖ Maintain high standards of academic integrity.
- ❖ Be in class every day. Excessive absences are grounds for removal from the course.
- ❖ The student commits to completing any summer work. Summer work may include but is not limited to summer reading, journal assignments, writing assignments, and projects.

higher level courses

All higher level courses are yearlong, and require acceptance into the Honors Program, as well as two teacher recommendations

Honors Courses

- Open to all grade levels
- Classes dive deeper into content and move at a faster pace

AP Courses

- Open to upperclassmen (11-12th grade)
- Classes provide college-level content
- Score of 3 or higher on the AP exam earns college credit

SUPA Courses

- Open to upperclassmen (11-12th grade)
- Classes provide college-level content
- Students pay a discounted fee to receive a Syracuse University transcript, and earn Syracuse University credit upon successful completion of the course

SYRACUSE UNIVERSITY PROJECT ADVANCE (SUPA)

Established in 1972, Syracuse University Project Advance is a premier concurrent enrollment program and one of the oldest and largest programs of its kind in the United States.

Through our program, qualified high school students have the opportunity to take Syracuse University courses during their regular high school day and earn college credit.

When you register for Syracuse University courses through Project Advance, you become a part-time, non-matriculated student at the University.

The Registrar's Office will maintain your academic records for the SU course(s) you take, just as it does for all Syracuse University students.

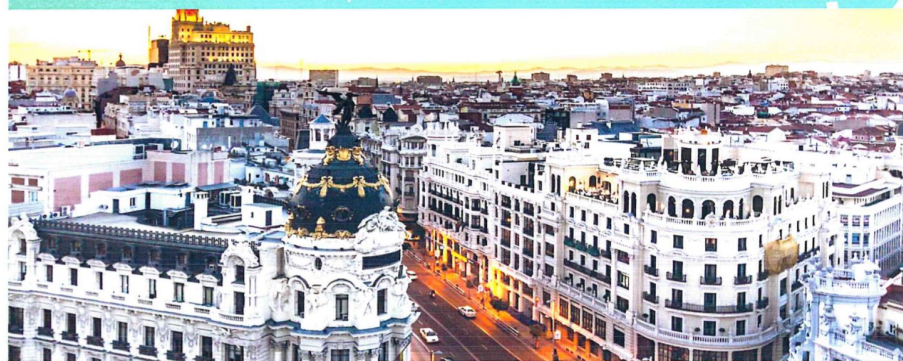

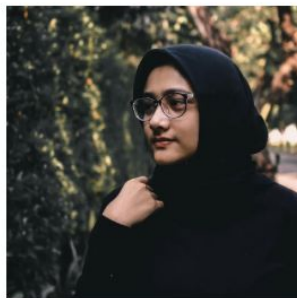

Debunking Myths

If a U.S. Citizen student has undocumented parents/spouse, they do not have access to FAFSA.



- Your parent or spouse doesn't need a Social Security Number to complete their section of the student's FAFSA form.
- Parents or spouses will be able to create a StudentAid.gov account without having an SSN to access their portion of your FAFSA form.

You can't go to college if you are undocumented.



- 427,000 undocumented students are enrolled in higher education in public and private institutions across the country.
- Nationally nearly 120,000 graduate from high school each year.

You can't get a job after high school or college if you are undocumented.



- There are ways in which the undocumented can have access to employment such as through becoming an independent contractor.
- Work based learning, stipends for undocumented students, partner with CBOs

You need to be a U.S. citizen/resident in order to own a business.



- Regardless of your immigration status you can file for your LLC and own a business
- There are approximately 58,900 undocumented entrepreneurs in New York State.

Desacreditando Mitos

Si un estudiante ciudadano estadounidense tiene padres/cónyuge indocumentados, no tiene acceso a la FAFSA.



- Su padre o cónyuge no necesita un número de seguro social para completar su sección del formulario FAFSA del estudiante
- Los padres o cónyuges podrán crear una cuenta de StudentAid.gov sin tener un SSN para acceder a su parte de su formulario FAFSA

No puedes ir a la universidad si eres indocumentado



- 427,000 estudiantes indocumentados están matriculados en educación superior en instituciones públicas y privadas de todo el país
- A nivel nacional, aproximadamente 120,000 personas se gradúan de la preparatoria cada año

No puedes conseguir un trabajo después de la secundaria o la universidad si eres indocumentado



- Hay formas en que los indocumentados pueden tener acceso al empleo, como convertirse en contratista independiente
- Aprendizaje basado en el trabajo, estipendios para estudiantes indocumentados, asociación con organizaciones comunitarias

Debe ser ciudadano/residente de los EE. UU. para ser dueño de un negocio



- Independientemente de su estado de inmigración, puede presentar su LLC y ser dueño de un negocio
- Hay aproximadamente 58,900 emprendedores indocumentados en el estado de Nueva York.

Access to Higher Education

Undocumented students **can go to college** and receive state financial aid in New York!

Senate Bill S1250: José Peralta New York State DREAM Act

- Undocumented students who meet the requirements can apply for state financial aid
- Provides undocumented students access to Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) and the Excelsior Scholarship

Currently there is no federal law that allows undocumented students to apply to federal funding at the national level.

Proyecto de Ley del Senado S1250: Ley DREAM del Estado de Nueva York

- Los estudiantes indocumentados que **cumplan** con los requisitos pueden solicitar ayuda financiera estatal.
- Brinda a los estudiantes indocumentados **acceso** al Programa de Asistencia para la Matrícula (TAP) y a la Beca Excelsior.

Actualmente, no existe una ley federal que permita a los estudiantes indocumentados solicitar fondos federales a nivel nacional.



In-State Financial Support: NYS Dream Act Eligibility

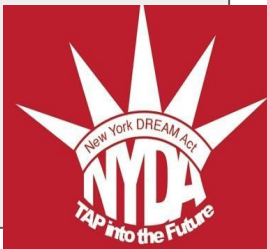


Requirements:

- Attend a NYS High School for 2+ years and enroll in NYS college within 5 years of graduating
- Receive a GED Diploma from NYS and enroll at a NYS college within 5 years
- Receive a NYS High School diploma/GED and enroll in Graduate studies within 10 years of graduating

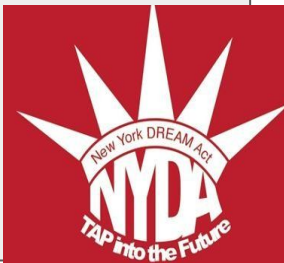


Requisitos:

- Asistir a una preparatoria en el estado de Nueva York durante más de 2 años y matricularse en una universidad del estado dentro de los 5 años posteriores a la graduación.
- Obtener un GED en el estado de Nueva York y matricularse en una universidad de NYS dentro de los 5 años.
- Obtener un diploma de una escuela preparatoria de NYS o un GED y matricularse en estudios de posgrado dentro de los 10 años posteriores a la graduación.

LISTA PARA EL CAMINO HACIA LA UNIVERSIDAD Para estudiantes indocumentados en Texas

Cuota de inscripción local del estado de Texas.

Requisitos de elegibilidad:

- Graduarse y obtener un diploma de una escuela secundaria (Preparatoria) publica o privada en el estado de Texas.
- Residir en el estado de Texas por lo menos tres años consecutivos, a partir de haberse graduado de la escuela secundaria o de haber recibido la educación equivalente a una escuela secundaria (GED).
- Haberse registrado como estudiante en alguna institución de educación superior no antes del semestre del otoño del 2001.
- Proporcionar una constancia legal jurada (Affidavit of Intent) que indique que la persona presentará una solicitud para convertirse en residente legal permanente, tan pronto como sea elegible para hacerlo.

***Nota: No se necesita la Acción Diferida para los Llegados en la Infancia (DACA) para ir a la universidad en Texas.

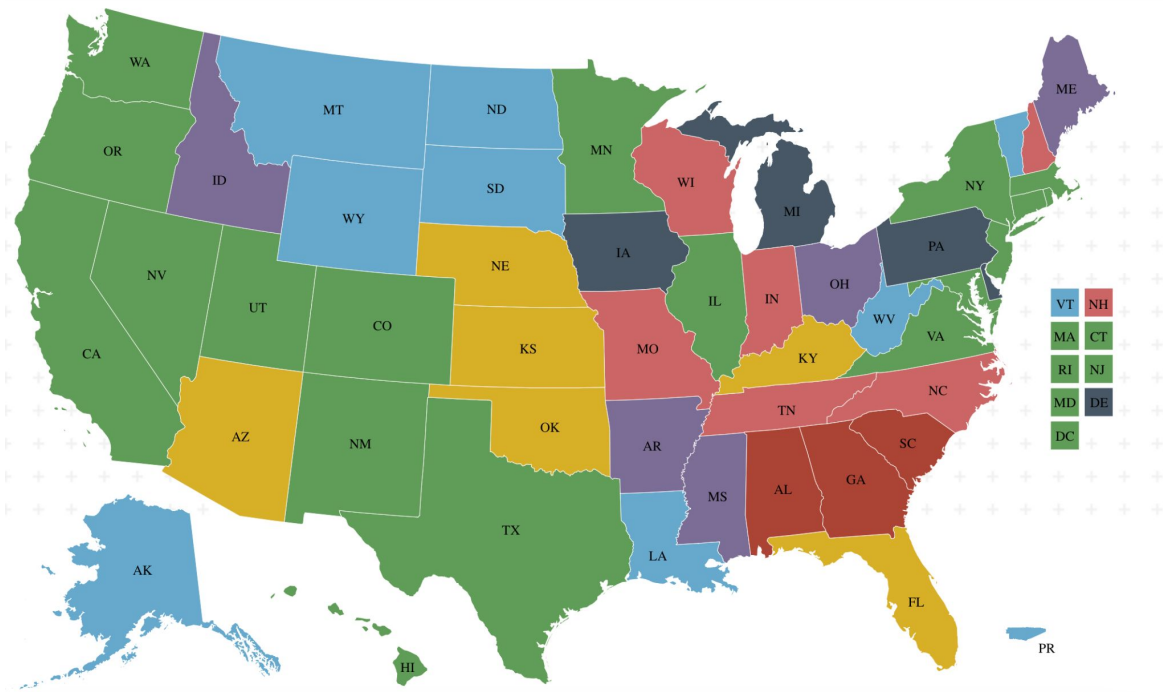

An Independent Contractor:

- An independent contractor is a person who works for themselves, producing a specific product within a set period of time.
- They are responsible for their benefits, losses, and debts, and must pay self-employment taxes.
- The payer controls only the result, not the process.
- An independent contractor can use an ITIN or EIN to pay taxes instead of a SSN.

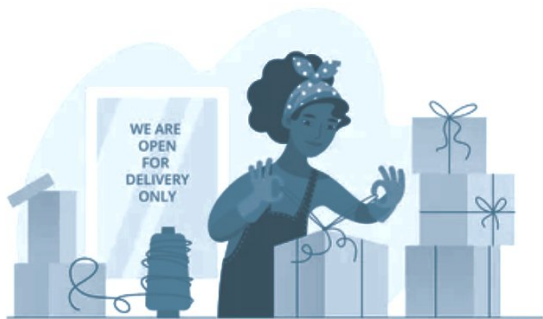


Un Contratista Independiente:

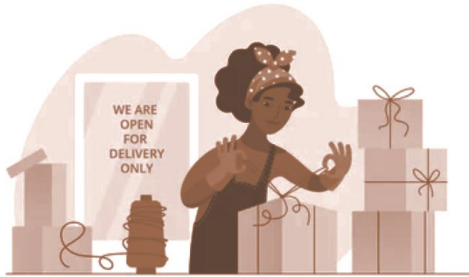

Forms needed as an Independent Contractor

- **W-7 Form:** Only needed to get an ITIN if you do not have a SSN and are not eligible to get one.
- **W-9 Form:** You give a W9 form to each entity you do business with.
- **1099 Form:** You get back a 1099 form at the end of year from each entity you conducted business with that paid you more than \$600 in one year. You use this form to file your taxes.
- **Written (and customized) Contract:** Given to each entity you do business with to justify your working relationship, outline your services, fees and duration of contract, and protect your intellectual property.
- **Invoice:** Given to each entity you do business with to get paid.

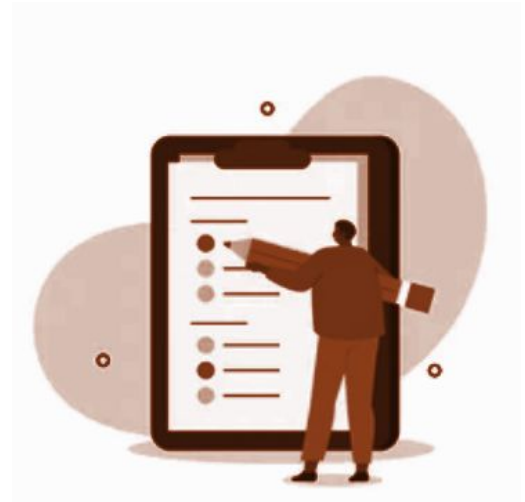
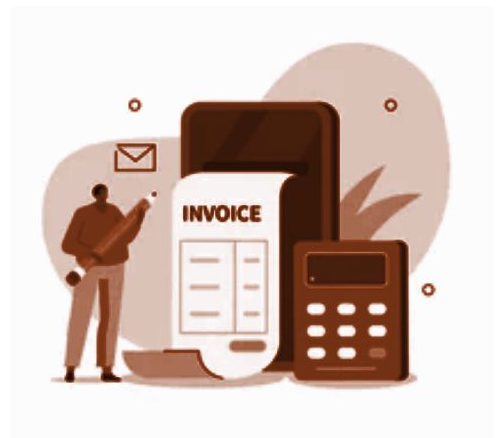

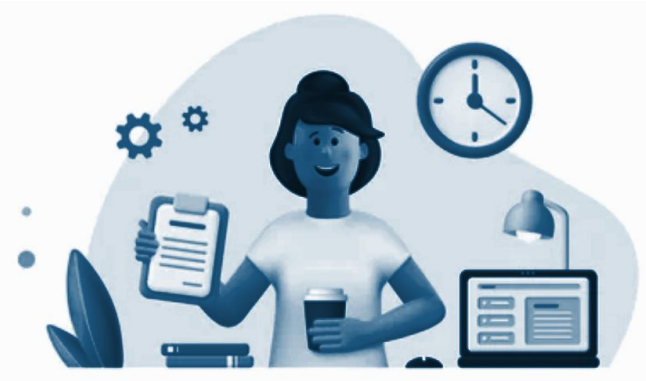
- **Formulario W-7:** solo es necesario para obtener un ITIN si no tiene un SSN y no está elegible para obtener uno.
- **Formulario W-9:** Usted entrega un formulario W9 a cada entidad con la que hace negocios.

Formulario 1099: recibirá un formulario 1099 al final del año de cada entidad que realizó negocios con los que le pagaron más de \$600 en un año. Tu usas este formulario para presentar sus impuestos.

- **Contrato escrito (y personalizado):** entregado a cada entidad con la que hace negocios para justificar su relación laboral, describir sus servicios, tarifas y duración de contrato y proteger su propiedad intelectual.
- **Factura:** Se entrega a cada entidad con la que hace negocios para recibir el pago.



LLCs: Limited Liability Company



- An LLC (Limited Liability Company) protects its members' personal assets from business liabilities.
- In New York, citizenship or legal residency is not required to form an LLC.
- Undocumented immigrants can use an ITIN instead of an SSN for taxes and business purposes.

LLCs: Compañía de Responsabilidad Limitada



- Una LLC (Compañía de Responsabilidad Limitada) protege los activos personales de sus miembros frente a responsabilidades comerciales.
- En Nueva York, no se requiere ciudadanía ni residencia legal para formar una LLC.

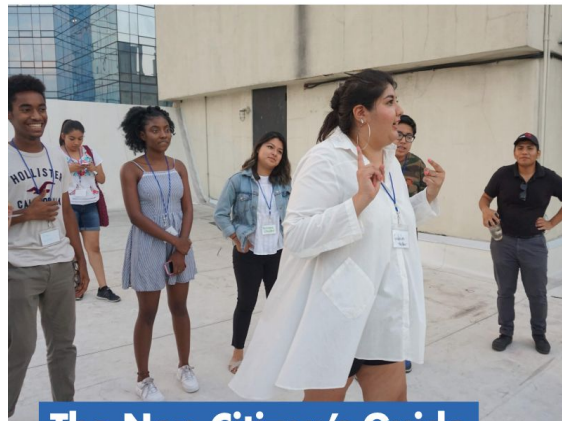

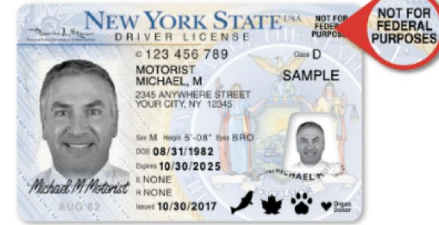
NYS Driver's Licenses



- The 2019 Green Light Bill in New York State allows undocumented immigrants to apply for a standard driver's license.
- All New York State residents age 16+ can apply for a standard driver's license or learner permit, regardless of immigration status.
- To qualify, applicants must provide proof of identity, residency in New York, and age.
- Accepted documents include passports, consular ID cards, and utility bills.
- The driver's license is not applicable to use for federal or voting purposes. All DMV Offices will provide language access assistance to individuals with limited English proficiency.

- La Ley Luz Verde en el estado de Nueva York, aprobada en 2019, permite que los inmigrantes indocumentados soliciten una licencia de conducir estándar.

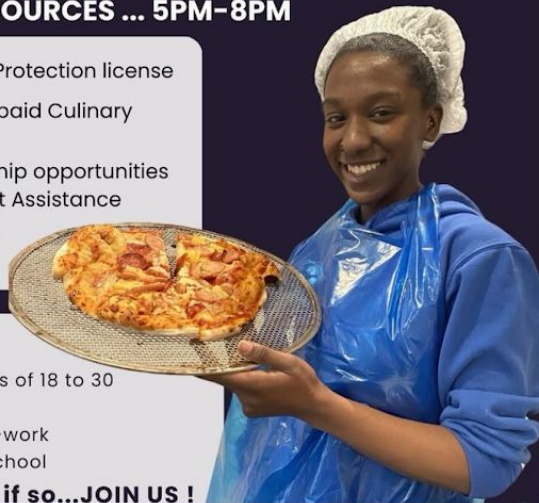

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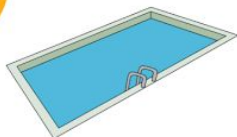
