Mammograms are the best way to find Breast Cancer early, when it is easier to treat and before it is big enough to feel or cause symptoms. Are you worried about the cost? CDC's National Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program offers free or low-cost mammograms to women who have low incomes and are uninsured or underinsured. Screening is important. Know Before You Go: Campus Visits

Your guide to making the most of your trip.



Plan Your Campus Visit

All colleges have admissions offices that can help you plan your visit. Your high school may organize group tours of nearby colleges. And you can plan your own informal visit to a college campus.

Take these important steps first:

- ✧ Visit the college's admissions website to get details about arranging for an in-person visit.
- ✧ Check with your school counselor to see if any campus tours are scheduled.
- ✧ Set aside time to be on your own. Walk around the public area.

What to Expect

Most campus visits will include the following:



An Information Session

An admissions representative will talk to you or your group about the college before the campus tour.



A Campus Tour

These are usually led by college students. You'll see the main parts of the campus and have a chance to ask questions.



At many colleges you can also arrange to...

- ◇ Attend a class.
- ◇ Meet with a professor.
- ◇ Meet with an admissions officer.
- ◇ Meet with a financial aid officer.
- ◇ Attend a club meeting or sports practice session.
- ◇ Eat in a dining hall.
- ◇ Spend the night in a dorm to experience student life.

Get Ready for Your Campus Tour

Before your visit, it's a good idea to do these things:



Explore Their Website

Review any materials the college has sent you. This will help you come up with questions specific to that college.



Prepare Questions

Make a list of questions to ask both staff and students.



View the Campus Map

Make a note of where the admissions office is so you'll know where you're going. This will help ensure that you're on time for your visit.



Additional Tips:



Take Notes

Take notes in your phone or notebook so that you don't forget the details of your collegiate trips.



Take Pictures

Take pictures so that you can remember what the campus looks like.

Teens and Vaping: What Are the Risks?

Electronic cigarettes (e-cigarettes) and vaping devices come in many forms, but they all heat liquids that are called e-liquids into aerosol. E-liquids usually contain nicotine, flavors and other chemicals.

Other names for e-cigarettes include vapes, vape pens, e-cigs or e-hookahs. While vape companies use tricks such as attractive packaging, flavors and advertising campaigns to make e-cigarettes seem harmless, they are not.



- ❑ **E-cigarettes usually contain nicotine.**
 - Nicotine is addictive, especially for teens.
 - Nicotine can negatively affect a teenager's memory and concentration, and may decrease learning ability.
 - Most e-cigarette pods can have as much nicotine as a pack of cigarettes or more.
- ❑ **Vaping can cause lung injury and affect lung health in other ways.**
- ❑ **The aerosol from heated e-liquids may contain harmful chemicals including:**
 - Formaldehyde, a cancer-causing chemical
 - Benzene, a cancer-causing chemical
 - Diacetyl from flavoring, which has been linked to lung disease
 - Heavy metals such as nickel, tin and lead
- ❑ **E-liquid ingredients are not closely regulated, and their long-term health effects are unknown.**
- ❑ **People have been poisoned by swallowing e-liquid or getting it on their skin or in their eyes.**
- ❑ **E-cigarettes are harmful to the environment and can contain plastic, electronic and hazardous waste.**

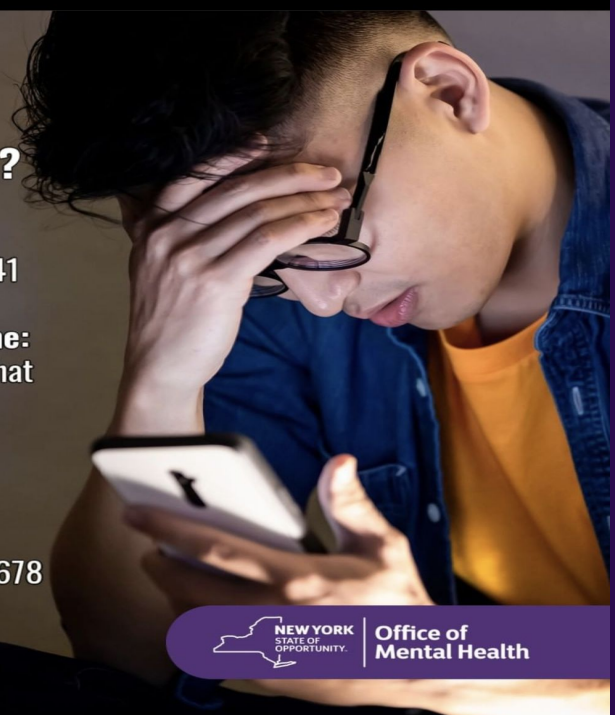

How to Avoid Fraud

- Only go to an attorney or Department of Justice accredited representative if you have immigration questions. Notaries or Notary Publics are not attorneys and cannot give legal advice. Attorneys from other countries who are not licensed by a state in the United States cannot give legal advice.
- Lawyers must have a license from a U.S. state to practice law – ask to see their law license.
- Accredited representatives have to be accredited and work for an agency recognized by the Board of Immigration Appeals. Ask to see their accreditation documents and confirm they work or volunteer for a nonprofit organization and their accreditation is not expired.
- Never sign an application with false information.
- Review all information on an immigration application before signing.
- Never sign a blank form.
- Ask for copies of everything you sign.
- Be skeptical of social media and other advertisements promising quick or new immigration relief.
- If the advice sounds too good to be true, get a second opinion before filing an immigration application.

Be Alert for Digital Scams

- The U.S. government (including Department of Homeland Security, U.S. Citizenship and Immigration Services, Immigration and Customs Enforcement, and State Department) will never contact you via WhatsApp or social media.
- With limited exceptions, such as people who are released from detention and told they must check in with ICE via telephone, the U.S. government generally does not contact individuals by phone.
- If you receive an unexpected message or phone call from someone who claims they are an immigration officer or other government official, do not respond or share personal information. Do not wire or transfer money to pay a “processing fee” or for any other reason.
- If in doubt, consult an attorney or accredited representative before taking any action.

What You Should Know

- You cannot apply for lawful permanent residency because you have been in the United States for a long time unless you have lived here continuously since January 1, 1972.
- If you apply for employment authorization or lawful permanent residence or other immigration benefits when you do not qualify, the Department of Homeland Security may start removal proceedings against you, which may result in your deportation.
- A lawful permanent resident may lose this status if he/she commits a crime or if he/she is outside the United States for more than six months without advance permission from the Department of Homeland Security.

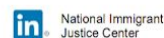

FAMILY PREPAREDNESS GUIDE FOR IMMIGRANT PARENTS: STANDBY GUARDIANSHIP

Every parent deserves peace of mind knowing their children will be safe and cared for, no matter what challenges arise.

If you're an immigrant parent, creating a plan for your child's future care and custody can help ensure they are always protected and supported.

There are several tools available to help you make the best choices for your family. Speaking with an attorney can guide you through the options that fit your needs. You are not alone. Resources and support are here for you and your family.

HOW TO DESIGNATE A STANDBY GUARDIAN

Choosing a standby guardian does not mean that a parent is giving up their parental rights. The guardianship goes into effect **only** if separation occurs. Parents can revoke a standby designation at any time.

The most common option allows parents to complete a form that will name the standby guardian. If a triggering event, called an "administrative separation," occurs, the standby guardians can act as guardian.

An administrative separation is when an immigration authority separates a parent from their child with an action like detention or deportation.

DESIGNATION OF PERSON IN PARENTAL RELATIONSHIP

In addition, or as a separate option, parents can complete a form called “Designation of Person in Parental Relationship” to name an adult authorized to make basic medical and educational decisions for their child.

Like standby guardianship, parents can choose to make the designation valid only if separation occurs and can be revoked at any time.

This option gives more limited powers to the named adult than standby guardianship and does not require going to court.

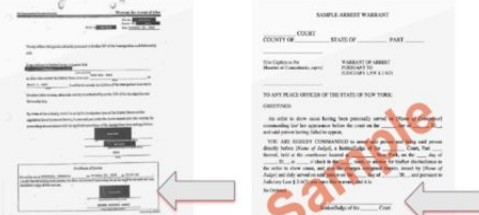

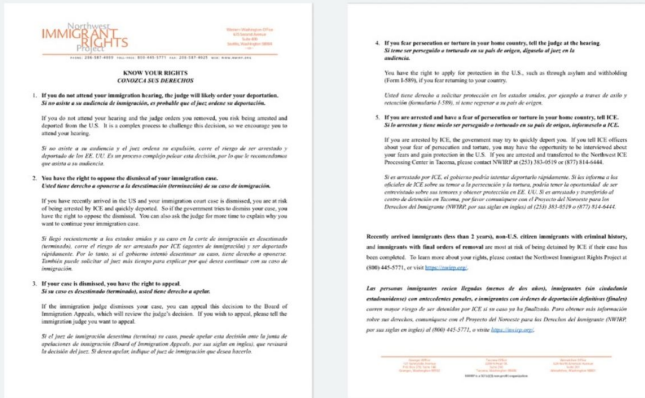

- Set a positive example by demonstrating a positive attitude toward education.



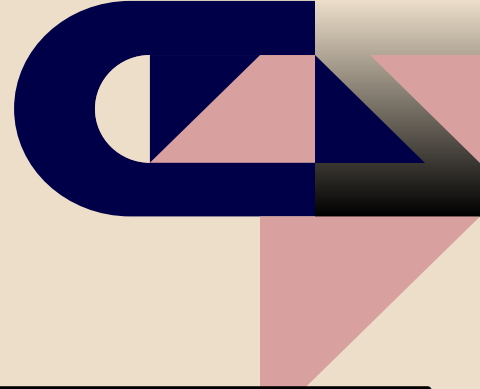


10 Ways to increase connection with your child

1. Spend quality one-on-one time with your child. This could be a special outing, or just some time spent together at home doing an activity of your child's choice.
2. Ask your child about their day and really listen to what they share with you.
3. Talk about your day and share your experiences with your child.
4. Engage in activities that you both enjoy.
5. Give your child praise and encouragement.
6. Read stories to your child or with them.
7. Take your child to the library or bookstore to pick out books together.
8. Give your child age-appropriate tasks and responsibilities around the house.
9. Respect your child's opinions, even if you don't agree with them.
10. Show your child love and affection in different ways, such as hugs, kisses, and meaningful compliments.

5 Ways To Ask a Question to Help a Teenager Open Up

(And get more than a one-word response!)



Use a respectful tone. *Teens shut down easily when feeling judged.*



Use Open Questions. *Invite your teen to keep talking.*



Keep it Simple. *Think how it would make you feel to be on the receiving end of too many questions.*

5 *Inviting* Words to Start Your *Open* Questions

When? *When would you be ready to...?*

What? *What makes ... so hard?*

Who? *Who do you the most?*

Which? *Which of these are to you?*

How? *How do you that?*



Examples of Closed Questions (can sound judgmental, shaming, disrespectful)

- Why did you do that?
- Are you ever going to grow up?
- Where have you been?
- Why didn't you call?
- Don't you think you owe me an apology?

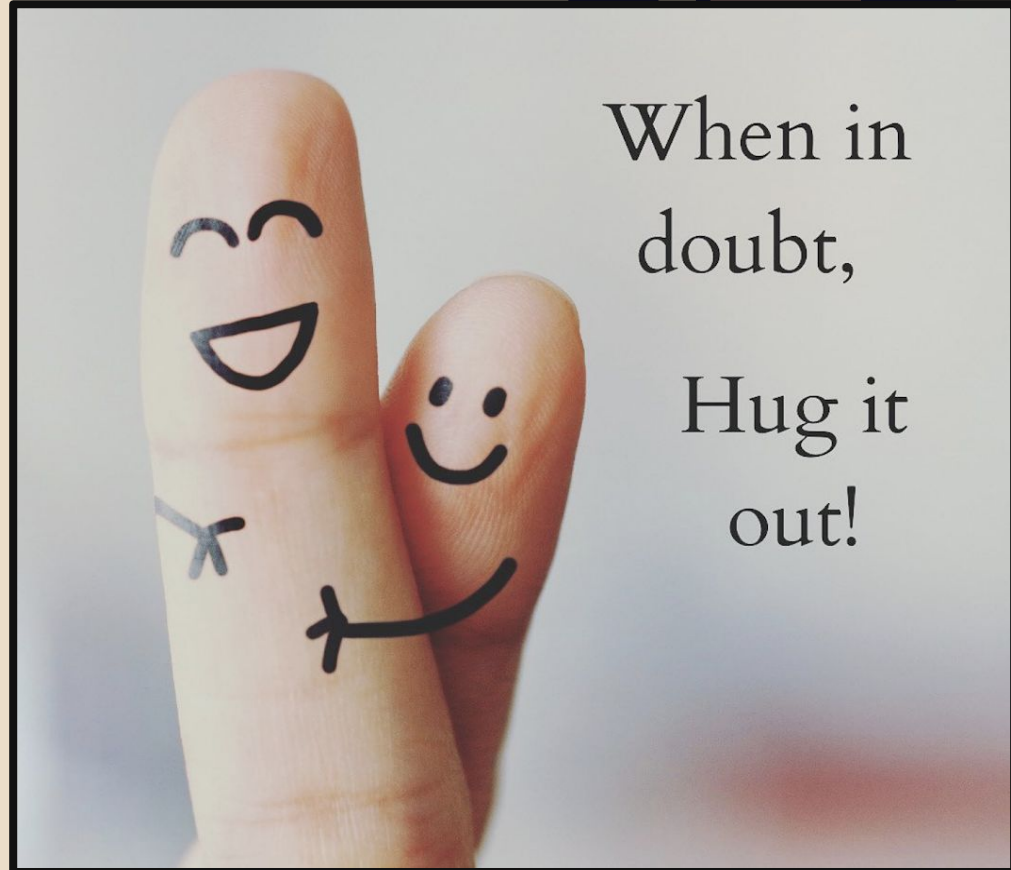


Keep Things in Perspective
